

Dominique Villeroy de Galhau



Dominique Villeroy de Galhau, a French national who was born in 1965, completed his diploma thesis "Techniques de Commercialization" in Nancy in 1985. Subsequently, he completed an apprenticeship in the stock exchange division at the BHF Bank in Frankfurt. This was followed by an apprenticeship in portfolio and asset management for private customers at the École des Hautes Etudes Commerciales de Paris and a diploma from the French society for financial analysis.

At the same time, Dominique Villeroy de Galhau worked as a securities broker and fund manager. From 1992 he worked at Creditanstalt Investment Bank Austria, whose Paris office he founded in 1996 and subsequently managed. He was employed by Tocqueville Finance SA (Paris) from 1998 to 2007, most recently as a member of the management board. In 2007, Dominique Villeroy de Galhau founded the financial services company La Financière Tiepolo SAS in Paris, and remains a member of the Management Board today. The company is dedicated to portfolio and fund management in the private sector.

He is chairman of the Adolphe de Galhau'schen Sophienstiftung in Wallerfangen (Saar), a member of the "Gérant de Patrimoines Privés" association in France and a member of the "Comité Consultatif des Diocèses de Versailles".

Dominique Villeroy de Galhau was elected to the supervisory board of Villeroy & Boch AG in 2015.
